## OFFICE MEMORANDUM

bject: Creation of a Central Point for receiving applications and designation of appellate authorities under the Right to Information Act, 2005.

The undersigned is directed to say that the sub-section (1) of Section 5 of Right to Information Act, 2005 mandates all public authorities to designate many Public Information Officers as necessary to provide information under 2 Act. The Second Administrative Reforms Commission in its First Report me 2006) has observed that where a public authority designates more than e Public Information Officer (PIO), an applicant is likely to face difficulty in proaching the appropriate Public Information Officer, and the applicants ould also face problem in identifying the officer senior in rank to the PIO to hom an appeal under sub-section (1) of Section 19 of the Act can be made. or convenience such an officer is termed as the First Appellate Authority). inter-alia, recommended that all ae Commission has, epartments/Agencies/Offices, with more than one PIO, should designate a odal Officer with the authority to receive requests for information on behalf of 1 PIOs. The Commission has also recommended that all the public authorities would designate the First Appellate Authorities.

It is, therefore, requested that all public authorities with more than one IO should create a central point within the organisation where all the RTI pplications and the appeals addressed to the First Appellate Authorities may be beceived. An officer should be made responsible to ensure that all the RTI pplications/appeals received at the central point are sent to the concerned tublic Information Officers/Appellate Authorities, on the same day. For the RTI applications/appeals may be received in the Receipt and Issue

- 3. Sub-section (8) of Section 7 of the RTI Act provides that where a requ for information is rejected, the Public Information Officer shall, inter-al communicate to the person making the request the particulars of the Appella Authority. Thus, the applicant is informed about the particulars of the Appella Authority when a request for information is rejected. There may be cases whe the Public Information Officer does not reject the application, but the applications not receive a decision within the time as specified in the Act or he aggrieved by the decision of the Public Information Officer. In such cases the applicant may like to exercise his right to appeal. But in absence of the particulars of the appellate authority, the applicant may face difficulty in making an appeal. It has, therefore, been decided that all the public authorities shall designate the First Appellate Authorities and publish their particulars along with the particulars of the PIOs.
- 4. All the Ministries/Departments etc. are requested to issue instructions to all concerned to take action accordingly.
